SYNOPSIS

On the eve of their sixth form graduation dance in the summer of 1988, Julie and Callum look into their future. An avid runner, Julie has dreams of going to the Olympics. Callum's ambition lies elsewhere; a keen and talented historian, he enjoys more humble aspirations. They boast a simple life, together at school, together at the track.

When Julie reveals to Callum an opportunity to chase her Olympic dream, he struggles to understand why he was left in the dark for so long. The young couple can't effectively communicate their feelings and they part ways.

Upon counsel from family and friends, they come back together at the dance. They realise it isn't worth ruining something so special over this. They don't know how long they'll have together, but they will make the most of what time they have.

INTERVIEW WITH DIRECTOR ANDREW FITZGERALD

How did your directing influences help in making this film?

Sounds obvious for a film student, but I love watching as many films as I can - particularly very intimate drama stories, I genuinely just love people-watching and seeing everyday interactions between people and this is something I want to take into my films.

With this film, I really wanted to attempt something very real and visceral. I think when writing we can have a tendency to overexplain or say too much, when in reality so much is said through microexpressions and awkward pauses. One of my favourite shows is Normal People, and if you haven't seen it - I'd highly recommend you do! - it perfectly encapsulates genuine communication and how raw it can be

Initially with the film, we were going for a more cheesy 80s tone, but to be honest, this wasn't something I was ever too in love with. The turning point for me was when I saw Past Lives in the cinema. I walked out and I was just in love. I remember watching it with our exec and we had a long chat afterwards about the upcoming film, and he saw how much I enjoyed it and just said to me, 'Why don't you make something like that?' And I just didn't have a good answer for him. So, I took everything I enjoyed about Past I ives and tried to use it in this film





How did you overcome struggles when making this film?

After resolving some initial issues early in pre-production with personnel, things were generally smooth sailing. I feel very lucky to have been able to work with such a passionate and hard-working team. Naturally, there were a lot of issues on set, but we found ways around them and no friendships ended as a result!

What was your favourite thing about being on set?

Honestly, I just love being on set in any capacity. Our exec, Riyadh, told me before we started shooting to take some time off before the edit because I'll need time to mourn being on set - and he was absolutely spot on. As someone who struggles to feel like they belong, I've never felt more at home than being on set with this incredible crew. I don't have enough superlatives to describe this experience, all I can say is thank you to every person who made it possible. To direct a crew of 30+ people and have every person feel happy and involved is the biggest privilege I've had in my life.

How did you come into your own on set?

As this was the first proper production I've had the opportunity to direct, I was cautious if I would be able to manage a crew of this size, as well as be able to focus on the actors and the story. Fortunately, I had great people around me and through delegating certain tasks, I could make the most of experience and come into my own.

My actors, Alexandra and Gabe, were absolutely brilliant and our work in pre-production allowed us to run through things super smoothly on set with micro pieces of feedback here and there. The three of us built such a great connection and we were always on the same wavelength.

I've learned so much from this experience and I'll always be grateful for it. I can't wait to be back on set as soon as I can and just learn more and more!

Have you made partnerships to last you into the industry?

I certainly hope so! I've loved every minute of working with every person on this crew and I can't wait to continue our collaboration into future projects. A piece of advice that was given to me by a director in the industry was to find yourself a producer to take with you. I can safely say that I have found that in Ben, the closest and best friend I have made at university. I love you, Ben!

I also want to shout out my DP, Jack. After certain events, he was thrust into this role and he has just gone from strength to strength. I can't begin to describe how proud I am to have worked with you, Jack, and I can't wait to see what we make next
